Enrollment or other circumstances may eliminate the GSI position from any course.

Duties for .50 and .75 GSI positions include 1) leading two discussion sections, 2) grading assignments, 3) office hours, and 4) other duties as outlined on the fraction calculation form. Duties for .60 GSI positions include 1) leading one discussion section, 2) grading assignments, 3) office hours, and 4) other duties as outlined on the fraction calculation form.

No international students holding an F-1 or J-1 visa are eligible to be employed at a .60 or .75 GSI position. Those visa holders are not permitted to be employed for more than 20 hours a week.

ULWR acronym: This is a course that has been approved by the Sweetland Writing Center as meeting the "Undergraduate Level Writing Requirement". Michigan has a writing requirement for all undergrads. Rather than routing all those students through the English department, the students can satisfy that requirement by taking courses in their own major that have a writing component. The department offers some ULWR courses every term. The GSI in these courses doesn't have a discussion section but helps the students with their writing assignments. First time GSIs in these courses have to attend a

1 hour meeting run by the Sweetland Writing Center folks for the first 6-9 weeks of the term. Once that training is done, you can work in any other ULWR course without repeating that training.

Selection criteria: Good standing as a doctoral student (as defined in the department's "Rules and Regulations of the Economics doctoral program") and satisfying all LS&A requirements for employment. No GSI position will be awarded to an applicant not enrolled in the doctoral program in economics until all qualified doctoral students in economics have been hired.

The Director of Graduate Studies in Economics awards all GSI positions based on the above criteria.

The deadline for submitting a GSI application for the Fall term 2009 is May 22. Selection decisions will be announced around the end of June.

To apply, active doctoral students in economics must submit a request for a Fall term 2009 GSI position to mbraun@umich.edu by the May 22 deadline. Any applicant who is not a doctoral student in economics must submit a resume, transcript of all economics coursework completed, and a reference letter from either a faculty member you have taught with previously or your current academic adviser if you have no previous teaching experience. These materials should be submitted as a hard copy to Mary Braun, Room 250 Lorch by the May 22 deadline.
