Dr. Tim Horsley has more than a decade of experience utilizing archaeological prospection methods on commercial and research projects in many parts of the world. He has a PhD in Archaeological Prospection from the Department of Archaeological Sciences, University of Bradford, UK, where he has taught at the graduate and undergraduate level. His PhD research took him to Iceland where he developed a specialty for applying geophysical methods in challenging environmental conditions. His geophysical research has included work in Europe, the Middle East, Asia and North America. He is a Research Scientist with the Museum of Anthropology, University of Michigan and a Visiting Scholar with the Department of Anthropology, University of Notre Dame, and is currently working on projects in France, China and the US.
