It examines the major social, political, and economic events that shaped America after the Civil War (Reconstruction, Industrialization, Progressivism, the New Deal, WWI and II, McCarthyism, Feminism, the Civil Rights Movement, Vietnam, Great Society Liberalism, etc.) This survey acquaints students with the urban, labor, African-American, and women's history of this period through both primary and secondary sources as well as film.
