 - leading discussion sections
 - grading assignments

 - GSI training if this is your first time as a GSI
 - being in Ann Arbor and available to attend the first Lecture
 - being in Ann Arbor and available to attend the final exam on the date and time specified in the University Time Schedule
 - keeping records of all grades and submitting final grades electronically within 72 hours of the scheduled final exam
- Qualifications Include:
 - Graduate student in good standing in the college
 - Successful completion of course work
 - Desired Qualifications:
 - Previous experience as a GSI, with favorable student evaluations
 - Previous experience teaching in History
- Selection Criteria:
 - History Ph.D. in good standing
 - Previous GSI

All GSIs are required to participate in the course evaluation process. The Fellowships committee will review evaluations of GSIs. If significant problems are apparent, they will make recommendations for remedying these. Subsequent appointment as a GSI will depend upon demonstrable effort to improve teaching skills and evidence of progress.
