

REGISTRATION INFORMATION AND TIPS - WINTER 2010

A printed OS course schedule is available on the web and in the student lounge. However, **Wolverine Access is the most up-to-date source for schedule information**. If you find a conflict between the OS schedule and Wolverine Access, Wolverine Access should be considered the most current information (please notify Cathy so that the OS schedule can be updated).

REQUIRED COURSES

OS Juniors must take the core course OS 305 Inside Organizations (if on campus)
OS Seniors who have not already completed the core must also enroll in OS 305.

SPECIAL ORGSTUDY COURSE OFFERINGS

OS 490.001 – Psych of Competitive Advantage, Professor Steve Garcia (OS juniors = Cluster C, OS seniors = research or Cluster C)
OS 490.002 – Political Networks Lab Group, Professor Michael Heaney (OS juniors = Cluster C, OS seniors = research or Cluster C)
OS 495.001 – Interest Group Politics, Professor Michael Heaney (Cluster B or C, student choice, also offered under PS 489.003)
OS 495.002 – Organization of Health Care Policy, Professor Jane Banaszak-Holl (Public Health) (Cluster B or C, student choice)
OS 495.003 – Networking, Professor Michael Heaney (Cluster A or C, student choice)

SPECIAL NOTE FOR 300-LEVEL ECON COURSES

Most spaces in 300-level Econ courses are reserved for juniors, sophomores and freshman at the start of registration. If you are a senior with a very early registration date, you might get one of the few spaces available to seniors. More senior spaces will open at the end of registration, provided the class does not fill with underclassmen. Take these courses as juniors for the best chance of getting in!

SPECIAL NOTES FOR ROSS BUSINESS SCHOOL COURSES

Mkt 300 is typically offered both in the fall and the winter. However, in the fall, almost all spaces are typically reserved for BBA students, and in the winter, all spaces are typically open. For W10, all spaces are open to LSA students - take it now if you can! If you can't take it this winter, you can try for next fall (but space will be tight), or wait for next winter if you are a junior.

MO 315, 321, and 470 have all spaces reserved for BBA students at the start of registration. The instructors in 315 and 470 are very familiar with and supportive of the OS Program. Contact them directly as early as possible to let them know of your interest and ask about overrides. The instructor for MO 321 is new to that course, but feel free to email him as well and explain your situation.

PREREQUISITES

On Wolverine Access, you will see two types of prereqs:

- **“Enforced” Prerequisites:** These are required, and the system will not let you register without the listed prereq.
- **“Advisory” Prerequisites:** These are recommended but not required; the system will allow you to register without them.

Special Note for Comm courses: The Comm dept is typically willing to waive the required Comm 101 or 102 enforced prereq for OS students who wish to take Comm 351, 361, 371, or 381. Contact Comm advisor Cheryl Erdmann (cerdmann@umich.edu) to obtain permission to register without the prereqs. She can also provide information on space availability.

CLOSED COURSES

For any course that is closed, ****ALWAYS**** put your name on the Wolverine Access waiting list (if there is one), and ****ALWAYS**** go to the first day of class. In addition, you may wish to contact the professor now for any information on space availability or waitlist priority. Many OS students have been able to obtain space in closed courses if they put forth a little effort. Many professors are familiar with the OS program and are very willing to grant overrides when you identify yourself as an OS major.

Business school courses present a particular challenge, as they are often closed to all LSA students at the start of registration. Some classes will open to LSA students after business school students have completed registration (but there is no notification – you just have to keep watching Wolverine Access for restrictions to be lifted). Many business school professors are familiar with OS, and you can email them early in the registration period to notify them of your interest in their course and to see if an override is possible.

PETITIONING COURSES

Remember that if you find an interesting course that seems to have organizational content, you may petition to have it count toward your major. Be sure to register for the course in order to hold your space, then send an email to Cathy that includes 1) the course description, and 2) a brief paragraph describing why you think the course should count for OS and how the course fits into your pathway. Cathy will respond as quickly as possible, usually within a few days.
