## DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY AND EVOLUTIONARY BIOLOGY AFFILIATE STATUS POLICY

- 1. Affiliate status may be granted to individuals who actively participate in teaching, research and/or curatorial activities within EEB or any of its affiliated units: Museum of Zoology, Herbarium, and/or the E.S. George Reserve. Affiliate status does not represent a formal appointment within the university, nor any kind of material commitment by the affiliated unit, Department or College. Rather it is a title intended to provide recognition to individuals who use the EEB facilities and contribute to the broader teaching and research mission. It is a means of encouraging collaborations and interactions between Affiliates and students or visitors who may become aware of the Affiliates on the Units' web pages or by other means.
- 2. Affiliate appointments should be proposed by individuals with formal appointments within the unit, and approved by the Chair or the leadership of the affiliated unit (EEB Museums or the E.S. George Reserve). The EEB Executive Committee will vote to approve or not approve the recognition. Affiliate status may be designated for up to 3 years and may be renewed. Initiation of the affiliate status and its renewal should include a brief letter indicating past and projected future relationship with the unit, and an updated CV.
