This document contains additional information that may be of interest but that is not formal policy.

Biodiversity Courses

All EEB undergraduate majors must take at least one course with a biodiversity focus. A biodiversity course should have two or more of the following as a primary focus:

- Understanding the link between form and function
- Understanding global biodiversity and key traits within a taxonomic group
- Identification & distribution/biogeography
- Understanding major evolutionary relationships and how that led to extinctions and diversification

All biodiversity courses should also address:

• Current research, conservation, or both
